Challenge:

"To one he gave five talents, to another two, to another one, each according to his ability."

Matthew 25:15 (NIV – because we know you love to add that in!)

Bible Story:

For the month of May, we are going to learn about parables in the bible. We are looking at the Parable of The Talents which can be found in Matthew 25:14-30. Read the story and watch the video below:

In this story, God is the master and we are his servants. The master in this story gave his servants talents to look after. Two servants took the talents and invested in them but one buried the treasure in the ground until the master returned. As a result the two that

invested their treasure were able to grow what they had been given but the one who buried their treasure couldn't. This parable reminds us that we each have different talents and gifts from God! We shouldn't bury our talent, we should learn what they are so that we can develop them and bring glory to God. I found this story about talents and thought I would share it with you:

"You all know what a frisbee is, but pretend for a moment that you do not know what it is and that you have never seen one before. You might think it was a dinner plate... or a hat... or perhaps a tool for digging in the sand. It could be just about anything, but it isn't. It is a Frisbee and the person who created the Frisbee created it for a purpose. The purpose of a Frisbee is to fly!

The Frisbee isn't very impressive to look at, is it? In a world full of high-tech electronic toys, it is pretty low on the totem pole. But boy, can it fly!

Sometimes you and I may look at the talents that God has given to others and think that God hasn't given us very much talent. We might be tempted to hide our talent. But when we use our God-given talent to be all that God intended for us to be... boy, can we fly!"

Craft:

The craft today will help you to focus on the talents that you have been given by God. Why don't you put your creation in your bible or somewhere that you will see it often to remind you of this story!

What you will need: Paper, colouring pens or pencils and some scissors.



- 1. Place your hand on a piece of A4 paper and trace your hand.
- Take some time to think of the talents that God has given you! Once you have done
 this, write them on your hand. You could even draw something that represents your
 talents.
- 3. Cut out your hand and place it in your bible or put it somewhere that you will see to remind you to use your talents for God!
