

Dear Friends,

As I look out the window from the study in the Manse on 23rd March it is clear that spring has sprung! It is another beautiful morning. Spring marks a new beginning, it tells us winter is over, there is new life all around us and the days are growing longer. Spring lifts our mood and our spirits.

Yet we know that at the same time while it is currently peaceful and beautiful here, many other parts of our world are filled with chaos and conflict. In fact it seems that our world is simply staggering from one crisis to the next. As I am writing this it is exactly two years since the Prime Minister announced the first lockdown as the Covid-19 pandemic took hold and life as we knew it changed dramatically overnight. But even as we wrestled with Covid our mainstream media were filling the news with warnings of the next crisis climate catastrophe. That then gave way to the cost of living crisis with inflation rising rapidly and then, on 24th February, Russia invaded Ukraine and so began the most serious conflict in Europe since the end of WW2. Chaos and conflict abound.

In the midst of all of this, I find myself amazed once again at just how relevant God's Word has been in the midst of all these crises. I had no idea when we set out on our studies in Daniel just how relevant and connected to current events Daniel would turn out to be. I had no idea back in December that Russia would invade Ukraine. I only had a strong sense that this was the right book to study next.

In recent weeks we have seen how God was still in control as in chapter 1 we find Daniel and his friends living as exiles in the land of Babylon. In chapter 2 we saw how God reveals His purposes. We have seen that the LORD is the one who, 'changes times and seasons, he sets up kings and deposes them' (Daniel 2:21). In chapter 3 we saw how Nebuchadnezzar sought to compel everyone in his administration to worship the huge golden idol he had set up.

When Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego refused to do it, out of their obedience to the one true God, they were cast into the fiery furnace. Through this we saw how God rescues. In chapter 4 we found Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon at the height of his power troubled by yet another disturbing dream. Through this dream, its meaning and its fulfilment, we see how the proud and arrogant Nebuchadnezzar is humbled and finally learns the lesson that God rules. 'The most high is sovereign over the kingdoms of men and gives them to anyone he wishes.' (Daniel 4:17) All these messages have been strikingly applicable to the days in which we are living.

Alongside this, Charlie's messages from Hebrews have been reinforcing the help and security that we find in Jesus Christ - the One who is our High Priest that we can approach to find help in our times of trouble and the One who is the sure and steadfast anchor for our souls in the midst of the storms raging all around us.

Is this all simply mere coincidence? Of course not – those who believe in a sovereign God know there is no such thing as coincidence. It proves the truth once again that God's Word is living and active - it speaks to God's people today as powerfully and as relevantly as it did for those who first heard it.

God's Word teaches us the truth about ourselves and the fallen world we live in but it also teaches us the truth about who God is and the hope that He has given us through the Gospel of Jesus Christ. And it is this that enables us to stand firm and not to give in to fear in unstable and fearful times.

That is why it is so vital for God's people to meet together for public worship. In doing this we encourage one another to remain true to our faith and we hear God's Word to us in our context today. How often do we miss the important message that God wants to speak to us because we have neglected to gather with God's people on the Lord's Day?

The uncomfortable reality we need to accept is that the times we are living through are not simply a temporary aberration which will eventually settle down and then everything will go back to 'normal'. The truth is you and I are living in the last days. But don't take my word for it, let us remind ourselves of what Jesus said, "You will hear of wars and rumours of wars, but see to it that you are not alarmed. Such things must happen, but the end is still to come. Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There

will be famines and earthquakes in various places. All these are the beginning of birth pains. Then you will be handed over to be persecuted and put to death, and you will be hated by all nations because of me. At that time many will turn away from the faith and will betray and hate each other, and many false prophets will appear and deceive many people. ¹² Because of the increase of wickedness, the love of most will grow cold." (Matthew 24:6-8)

Doesn't that accurately describe the days in which we are living? Wars, nation rising against nation, famine and earthquakes, persecution and many turning away from the faith. But happily that is only half the story. There is hope, as Jesus goes on to say, "but the one who stands firm to the end will be saved. And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come.' (Matthew 24:13-4)

The end is coming, this present world is passing away but that ending will lead to a New Beginning. That new beginning dawned 2000 years ago at that empty tomb outside Jerusalem. That day everything changed. We want to explore that new beginning over this Easter, because in that new beginning that Jesus ushered in through his death and resurrection, we find our sure and certain hope. The present world is approaching its end but the events we are living through are, as Jesus said, the beginning of birth pains, birth pains lead ultimately to a new birth and a new life. God has, through Jesus, established a new beginning, a new kingdom that is currently growing subversively within the ruins of the world's kingdoms but it is a kingdom that will never come to an end. That unbreakable and unending kingdom has an embassy in our local community called Railway Street Presbyterian Church that we are privileged to belong to. So we do not panic, we do not give in to fear, we do not lose heart. We enjoy a deep confidence even as the chaos and the conflict rages, for God is God and he is in control and His kingdom will not pass away.

So let us understand, experience, live out and share the message of that **New Beginning** and the wonderful reality that, "if anyone is in Christ they are a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!" (2 Corinthians 5:17)

LINK - APRIL UPDATE

We have now held our 7th site progress meeting and paid our 5th certified invoice. Unfortunately due to various factors the builders have identified that we are now a month behind our initial plan. On the brighter side the observant among you will notice that the steelwork is now up and nearing completion. The brick and block work for the external walls and the toilet block are progressing well.





The wall between the hall and kitchen has been removed and rebuilt as a thinner section with a larger service hatch and our kitchen supplier will now be coming out to take their final measurements so we can then put the plans in place to get the new kitchen installed.

The kitchen team are now looking at the likely coffee dock use by organisations throughout the week and the potential equipment requirements. The finishes team have visited 1080 (Alpha) furnishings to look at potential furniture options and colours. Based on our discussion with 1080 they have now provided us with a furnishing proposal including a cost estimate. The team

continue to meet to further review and refine our finishes and furnishings requirements.

The Organ loft protection remains in place and you will be pleased to hear that after the demolition and piling work the area was inspected and no issues were found.

We continue to be very grateful for the generous support given by our church family to this project, especially given the more challenging economic environment we are now living in. The generous support provided means that we have not started to use the Bank loan as yet which, in turn, is helping to keep our financial costs under control.





We are planning to have a Gift Day for the Link Development on 8 May and more details will be provided in next month's Bulletin.

Pray for Ukraine

At 5am on Thursday, <u>Russia invaded Ukraine</u> on three separate fronts: in the north from Belarus, in the east from Donetsk, and in the south from Crimea.

The horrific scale of the force – around 150,000 troops – and the severity of the initial assault were shocking. As disorientated Ukrainians mobilised to defend their nation, Putin chillingly warned that any country coming to their aid would face consequences the like of which had never been seen before.

The West has promised <u>unprecedented sanctions</u>, though Ukrainian appeals for financial support are increasingly giving way to pleas for military assistance.

Putin invaded on the invented pretence of liberating the country from genocide and neo-Nazism, positioning himself as some sort of justice-seeking saviour. But this is patent hypocrisy, supposedly 'saving' people through bloodshed and violence, purporting to keep peace whilst pursuing war.

It's similar to the modus operandi of the Roman empire, who oppressed people in the name of peace and order 2,000 years ago. Except this time, it's not down Roman roads, but Russian roads, that the war machines roll.

Yet, in a world of power and violence, Christ came not as the Messiah many expected. He overthrew Rome not by force, but by sacrificial love. In truly liberating the oppressed, the only blood this Messiah shed was his own, rebuking his disciples for trying to win by violence (Mark 8:29–33). Whatever road his followers take, cross-bearing is a precondition.

This wasn't, however, a martyr complex. Jesus came to defend the vulnerable and complete his mission, which justified defensive swords smuggled into the garden of Gethsemane (Luke 22:38).

So, what might a Christlike response look like here?

It might look like the self-sacrifice required to put in place tough sanctions on Russia, even when measures hurt us as well. And, God help us, it may mean boots on the ground of a vulnerable nation to confront injustice. Whatever way we take, it will be <u>fuelled by prayer</u>, as genuine peace is beyond what we can secure in our own strength.

So, we pray for the Prince of Peace to reign over this conflict. We pray against bloodshed, and for violence to quickly end. We pray for wise leaders, and peacemakers on every side. Lord, show us how to defend the vulnerable. And may comfort and compassion conquer fear and violence.

For we pray in the knowledge that, just as Rome fell within centuries of Christ's victory on the cross, the kingdom will always outlast the empire.
