Dear Friends,

inspired to follow the down-to-earth Saviour in our everyday lives.




Belfast City Mission Christmas Gift Service - Sunday 7th December

Safeguarding

The 12th November was a day very few of us will forget quickly. At a press conference in Assembly Buildings that afternoon the Moderator of our Presbyterian Church, the Right Rev Dr Trevor Gribben, announced that he would resign and retire from active ministry on 30th November 2025. This was as direct result of the identification of serious failings in safeguarding in Assembly Buildings between 2009 and 2022.

The adverse impact of this upon the Presbyterian Church in Ireland has been significant so far and is likely to remain so for some time to come. The Convenor of the General Council, Rev Dr David Bruce provided a statement for the press following the Moderator's announcement and the Acting Clerk, Rev Dr David Allen, provided a statement that was read to all our congregations at services of worship on 16th November. Copies of these statements and associated reports are available in full on the PCI website. As an

investigation is currently being undertaken by the PSNI we are advised that no additional information in relation to these matters can be provided at this time.

These unprecedented

events have left many within our church and the wider community badly shaken. There is deep sorrow, great confusion and a significant amount of anger at what has happened. We want answers, we want to know why this has happened and what needs to be done to care for and help those hurt, we want to ensure that what has gone so badly wrong is put right and steps taken to make sure this never can happen again. Most of all, many within our denomination, and in our own church family, are deeply upset that the name of our Lord Jesus has been dishonoured and the work of His Kingdom damaged by what has happened. We cry out to God for forgiveness, lament what has taken place, repent of the sin that surrounds this and seek God's restoring grace.

It is worth stressing that this issue relates to Assembly Buildings and not to local congregations. Rev Dr Allen made clear in his statement that safeguarding in congregations has been, and continues to be, undertaken to a high standard.

I want to assure you that safeguarding of our children, young people and vulnerable adults is taken extremely seriously in Railway Street. Our Safeguarding Policy is available on our website, and in addition, we have a dedicated Safeguarding section on our website with key information for any who need it. Our Designated Person is Dr Sam Mitchell and our Deputy Designated Person is Mrs Pamela McElhinney – both are available should anyone have a concern. To ensure that safeguarding is considered appropriately it is an agenda item for consideration at every stated meeting of Kirk Session. We apply our policy and procedures robustly within a strong governance framework seeking to discharge our responsibilities to the very highest standard.

As explained on the form, car park fees must be received by **31st January 2026** otherwise the fob will become invalid.

Finance Update November 2025

As we come towards the end of the year, I would like to thank our church family for your continued generous giving to both our own needs and to the needs of others. Your generosity in these financially challenging times is greatly appreciated.

In early 2023 we availed of a loan of £625,000 from our Bank. This loan is to be repaid over 10 years with monthly payments of around £6000. This loan operates on the same way as a capital and interest mortgage with each monthly repayment being made up of an element of capital and of interest. We receive approximately £3000 in monthly giving to the Link Account with the balance required to meet our monthly payments coming from the twice yearly Gift Days in May and November. Our debt to the Bank will be around £550,000 at the end of this year. Given that we have paid all the invoices relating to the Link Project we anticipate that we will be able to use funds received for property that are not required for monthly payments to make reductions in the capital amount we owe during 2026 and in future years.

Alongside this, our congregation continues to raise funds for others with £2,848 donated for the World Development Appeal in this year's Harvest offering and £385 donated for the Earl Haig Funds on Remembrance Sunday. This is alongside giving to both the Shoe Box and Foodbank appeals. We are grateful to all who have supported these funds and commend the Christmas collections for the Belfast City Mission and Lisburn Foodbank for your generous consideration.

In line with previous Financial Updates, ongoing inflationary pressures continue to impact our main operating account, our No 1 account.

Very simply, we need to have our giving to Free Will Offering (FWO) increase in line with inflation to ensure that our income covers our expenditure. Whilst a significant amount for FWO comes in during December, the year-on-year position is only marginally improved (when compared to 2024) as we head into the final month of the year. As such, we have had to draw on a small overdraft facility of £10,000 to help us manage our cashflow.

We are asking that where you can, it would be of considerable help to the management of our No 1 account, for those giving to FWO to do so by monthly standing order. We realise that this does not work for everyone but would be grateful for those who can to move to this way of giving to our Church.

Overall, the use of 'Electronic' giving continues to increase and we thank all those who have set up new and increased regular contributions to the church bank accounts. Bank details are set below and if you can use this method, it would be of real help to us.
