## Regaining our Focus

Dear Friends,

Summer holidays are great and essential after a busy year whether at school or work or in church life. It is good to take a break from the normal routine and to enjoy time where your life is not dictated by your diary. I enjoyed time off in the Kingdom of Mourne



and also some days in the beautiful city of Krakow.



When on my summer holidays I especially enjoy that feeling when I get to the point where I struggle to remember what day it is. That is a sign you have truly relaxed and switched off.


But of course holidays are the

exception rather than the norm and they pass all too quickly. There comes a point when we have to face that fact that we need to get back to normal patterns and activities. There is, I think, something a little mournful about the end of August especially as we notice the days starting to shorten once again and as children and teachers have to go back to school! But on the other hand it is good to get back to a more disciplined routine and a renewed focus on those things that are important.

The same is true in terms of our walk of Christian discipleship. Sometimes it's like we take a holiday from our call to daily discipleship, we lose our focus or we get distracted by the things of this world and we take our eyes off Jesus. As a result sometimes we need to refocus our attention and time on those things that are of first importance. We need to fix our eyes on Jesus afresh.

The Christian disciples that the letter to Hebrews was written to were in danger of taking their eyes off Jesus as they were distracted by other things hence the call to them in Hebrews 12, "Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith."

Let me remind you of our church purpose statement in Railway Street - it says, 'Following Christ, Serving the Community - In obedience to Christ, we will work together to see people coming to faith in Christ and growing in love for God and others.' This is our primary activity -



following Jesus and seeking to make him known. Never forget that the greatest service we can do for our community is to introduce them to the person of Jesus Christ.

So we want our focus to be centred on Jesus this autumn. Now in many ways I believe that is already the case in Railway Street. Our worship and teaching is, I hope, always Christ centred. We also know that all the scriptures whether we are reading the Old Testament or the New are all about Jesus. But there is something speical about getting back to the life and ministry of Jesus as we find it in the four Gospels. Several years ago we made our way through the whole of Mark's Gospel. This autumn we will turn to

John's Gospel as we follow a new teaching series – 'The Word Made Flesh – Encountering Jesus in John's Gospel.'

In addition to this we intend to run a 'Christianity Explored Course' later in the autumn. You can read more details about this on pages 8 and 9 in the bulletin. Earlier this year we had two Christianity Explored Courses in RSPC. We had one on Wednesday afternoons for those free during the day and we also used 'Vox' - the youth version on Friday evenings. The forthcoming course will take place on a weekday evening in order to make it available to everyone.

## What can you do as we seek to fix our eyes on Jesus afresh?

- Take time to read through John's Gospel in advance of our Sunday teaching series beginning on 7th September
- Pray that the Holy Spirit will help you to encounter Jesus in a fresh way on Sunday mornings
- Think about friends or family who don't yet know Jesus that you could invite and bring along to Christianity Explored
- Pray that God will draw people to saving faith in Jesus Christ.

May the name of Jesus be honoured and glorified as we step forward into a new session of worship, work and witness in His church.

## What is Christainity Explored?

As Christians we are convinced that the Gospel of Jesus Christ is the best news we can ever hear. We're also convinced the best way to discover the good news about Jesus is by opening up the Bible together. The Christianity Explored course is deisgned to help people meet Jesus in the pages of the Bible.

### Who is it for?

The course is open to anyone. You may already be a Christian and you want to grow in your knowledge of Jesus. Maybe you have been attending church for years but would still not describe yourself as a Christian. Or perhaps you have started attending church in more recent times and you feel yourself drawn to Jesus and want to know more. Maybe you're a Christian and you would love to invite non Christian friends to come along and learn for themselves why you follow Jesus.

### What is involved?

Over seven sessions we read Mark's Gospel to find out more about the life of the person at the heart of the Christian faith – Jesus Christ.

The structure of each session is simple: a short Bible study in small groups, a video talk and a small group discussion based on the talk. This all happens in a relaxed and informal setting in The Link at RSPC.

There is no cost – the course and all the materials you need will be provided free.

## When will the course be taking place?

The plan is to hold the course on a **Wednesday evening at** 7:30pm beginning on 15th October.

## Finance update

You may recall from previous Finance updates that our No:1 Account has been under pressure as a result of the impact of both inflation and the increase in employer National Insurance Contributions. Unfortunately this has continued to be the case and, while we are very grateful for the increase in giving from many of our contributing families, our operating expenditure for this year is still forecast to be greater than our income. The Congregational Committee are considering options for increasing income from sources other than Free Will Offering and we will share the outcome of this work in due course.

That said, the suggested increase in giving of £4 per month per contributing family remains appropriate and if your family has not done so, and is able to, we would be grateful if you could help our church in this way.

We are very thankful to all who give to the work of our church by whatever means. We continue to see increase in the proportion of those who give by monthly standing order and find that this is especially helpful in managing our budget and cashflow. If you currently give by FWO envelope and could change your method of giving to standing order that would be very helpful, please speak to me or another member of the Finance team and we can arrange this. If giving by FWO envelope is the best way for you to give to our church then we are very grateful that you continue to do so.

As advised in the last Finance Update, all invoices relating to the Link project have now been paid. We are now concentrating on repaying the remaining balance on the Bank Loan, currently standing at almost £565,000. The recent reduction in the Bank Base Rate will help reduce the interest we pay on our outstanding debt. We will have our next Gift Day for the Link on 16 November 2025 and more details will be provided in the next Bulletin.
